



Programmatic funding levels for key HIV-related programs in the Consolidated Appropriations Act of 2023:

Department of Health and Human Services

- **\$3.294 billion** for the **HIV research** budget at the **National Institutes of Health**, a **\$100 million increase** from the **FY 2022 enacted level**.
- **\$613 million** across the Department of Health and Human Services to continue efforts toward the federal **Ending the HIV Epidemic (EHE) initiative** to implement effective prevention, diagnosis and treatment strategies in the target counties and states, including:
 - \$220 million for CDC's EHE Division of HIV/AIDS Prevention, a **\$25 million increase**;
 - \$157.3 million for the Bureau of Primary Health Care (BPHC), a **\$35 million increase**;
 - \$165 million for HRSA's Ryan White EHE program, a **\$40 million increase**.
- **\$2.571 billion** for the **Ryan White HIV/AIDS Program**, including:
 - \$680.8 million for **Part A**, a **\$10.3 million increase**;
 - \$464.6 million for **Part B: Care**, a **\$20.6 million increase**;
 - \$900.3 million for **Part B: AIDS Drug Assistance Programs**, level funding;
 - \$209 million for **Part C**: a **\$3.5 million increase**;
 - \$77.9 million for **Part D**: a **\$1.1 million increase**;
 - \$34.9 million for **Part F: AIDS Education and Training Centers**, a **\$0.5 million increase**;
 - \$13.6 million for **Part F: Dental**, a **\$0.2 million increase**;
 - \$25 million for **Part F: SPNS**, level funding.
- **\$1.391 billion** for CDC's Divisions for **HIV, Viral Hepatitis, STI Prevention and TB Elimination**, including:
 - \$1.013 billion total for the Division of HIV prevention, a **\$27 million increase**:
 - \$755.6 million for HIV Prevention, **level funding**;
 - \$38.1 million for School Health, a **\$2 million increase**.
 - \$43 million for viral hepatitis, a **\$2 million increase**;
 - \$174.3 million for STD prevention, a **\$10 million increase**;
 - \$137 million for TB elimination, a **\$2 million increase**;
 - \$23 million for opioid-related infectious diseases, a **\$5 million increase**.
- **\$8.5 million** for **Telehealth Centers of Excellence (COE)**, a **\$1 million increase**, and COEs are urged to work on systems for States to integrate telehealth into their state health provider networks.
- **\$60 million** for the **HHS Minority AIDS Fund**, a **\$3.1 million increase**.

Department of Housing and Urban Development

- \$499 million for the Housing Opportunities for People with HIV/AIDS (HOPWA) program, a **\$49 million increase**.

State Department and U.S. Agency for International Development

- \$4.395 billion for the President's Emergency Plan for AIDS Relief, a **\$5 million increase**.
- \$2 billion for the Global Fund, a **\$440 million increase**.
- \$330 million for USAID Global HIV/AIDS program, **level funding**.
